Every year in October, Spirtas returns to Ladue High School to star in a performing arts scholarship concert. The show is produced by his high school music teacher and mentor, Jo Anne Smiley, and features Ladue graduates. "Jo Anne has been my mentor for 30 years," Kevin says with affection. "She has been very instrumental in helping me find my voice literally and metaphysically."
